Dear Supporter of Hawai'i Birds,

After a successful revival of the Hawai'i Island Festival of Birds in 2024, we are back again in Hilo! We invite you to join us at the Hawai'i Island Festival of Birds at the Grand Naniloa Hotel Hilo on October 26, 2024, from 9am to 5:30pm. This is a joint event by the Hawai'i Wildlife Center and Conservation Council for Hawai'i.

The 2024 festival theme is "Celebrating Connection", highlighting the different connections between birds, environments, people, and culture. The vision for HIFB 2024 is to explore how native birds impact the world around them, how organizations work together towards shared conservation goals, and what we can do as a community to help protect these species. Our approach is to lead with joy. This is a time to recharge, share important bird knowledge, honor the species we're all working to protect, and prevent hopelessness in the face of tough conservation challenges.



#### The 2024 full-day festival will feature:

- **Presentations and Shared Mana'o in the Crown Room:** Guest presentations will touch on a wide range of native bird topics and how the community can get involved with conservation. Hālau that participated in last year's Hula Manu Hō'ike have been invited back and given the freedom to present hula or present on a manu topic of their choosing. This year's speaker panel will be on Papahānaumokuākea.
- **Bird Fair**. The bird fair has been a staple of the Hawai'i Island Festival of Birds since its inception in 2016. The HIFB Bird Fair provides a stage for local artists and crafters who incorporate native bird designs in their work to showcase their products. The fair also highlights native bird conservation organizations and wildlife agencies doing critical work to save native species.
- New this year: Sound Baths: No, not the wet kine! We are working with the LOHE lab at UH Hilo to incorporate soundscapes into the Crown Room program to bathe the audience in birdsong. The goal: to give an aspirational preview of what Hawai'i could sound like if we do our part to bring back our birds.
- New this year: Bird Fair Learning Lounge: We've added more space to our festivities, including the lobby lānai of the Grand Naniloa which will be a "learning lounge" featuring select conservation organizations and wildlife agencies. This area will be free the whole day and anyone can come and explore without having to purchase festival admission.

# 'Io Sponsor - \$2,500 or more

The 'Io, Hawaiian Hawk, is often seen soaring high in the sky. This regal bird is often a symbol of royalty and regarded by many families to be a kinolau of their 'aumakua. He 'io au, 'a'ohe lālā kau 'ole. I am a hawk, there is no branch on which I cannot perch.

# 'Ākepa Sponsor - \$1,000 - \$2,499

The Hawai'i 'Ākepa is a small honeycreeper known for their brilliant orange color. It takes males three years to develop their characteristic bright orange plumage. They can be seen foraging for insects high up in the canopy of old-growth forests.

# 'Alawī Sponsor - \$500 - \$999

The 'Alawī, Hawai'i Creeper, is a small cryptic honeycreeper that is often mistaken for 'Amakihi. They search for insects by creeping up tree trunks and branches.
